# Mining Josef Herman Market Place

The internationally renowned artist Josef Herman lived in Ystradgynlais between 1944 and 1955, where he became part of the community and was fondly nicknamed "Joe Bach". His painting, drawings and prints during that time captured the life of the community, most notably in his images of miners. In 2002 the Josef Herman Art Foundation Cymru was established in Ystradgynlais to honour Josef Herman and his legacy and to encourage the public appreciation of the visual arts by people of all ages.

The Josef Herman Art Foundation Cymru is now embarking on a new and exciting two-year partnership project with Tate called Mining Josef Herman, as part of a larger project called Transforming Tate Britain: Archives and Access that will enable new audiences to engage with Tate's digitised archives and interactive learning hub, and to work with artists to make their own creative responses for publication online. As part of the project the Foundation's own archives will be organised and digitised and will be accessible through local archives and the National Library of Wales, Aberystwyth.

The Mining Josef Herman Market Place marks the start of this project, offering a day of presentations, activities, discussion and stalls, hosted by local, regional and national groups and organisations (such as the People's Collection Wales, the National Eisteddfod of Wales and the Ystradgynlais Heritage Society, to name but a few) and an opportunity to get involved in the project by sharing your stories, ideas, images and memories of Josef Herman's work; the life and times in which he lived; what his legacy means to Ystradgynlais and how it can benefit the town and the surrounding area.

**Bu yr arlunydd byd-enwog Josef Herman yn byw yn Ystradgynlais rhwng 1944 a 1955 lle y daeth yn rhan bwysig o'r gymuned a chael y ffugenw hoffus 'Joe Bach'. Roedd ei luniau, darluniau a phrintiau yn adlewrrchu bywyd glofaol y gymuned, yn enwedig ei ddelweddau o lowyr yr ardal. Ffurfiwyd Sefydliad Celf Josef Herman Cymru yn 2002 i anrhyydeddu Josef Herman a'i waith ac i hybu gwerthfawrogiad o'r celfyddydau gweledol ym mhobl o bob oedran.**

Erbyn hyn mae Sefydliad Celf Josef Herman Cymru wedi ffurio partneriaeth newydd a chyffrous gyda Tate, o'r enw 'Mining Josef Herman' sydd i barhau am ddwy flynedd fel rhan o'r brosiect ehangaf sef 'Transforming Tate Britain; Archives and Access'. Bydd hyn yn galluogi cynulleidfa oedd newydd i ddefnyddio archifau digidol a'r cap dysgu rhwngweithiol yn ogystal â gweithio gydag arlunwyr i gynhyrchu eu hymatebion personol er mwyn eu harddangos ar-lein. Fel rhan o'r brosiect trefnir a digidolir archifau Sefydliad Celf Josef Herman Cymru ac yn y dyfodol bydd y rhain ar gael mewn archifau lleol a Llyfrgell Genedlaethol Cymru Aberystwyth.

Man cychwyn y brosiect newydd yw 'Mining Josef Herman Market Place' sy'n cynnwys diwrnod o gyflwyniadau, gweithgareddau, trafodaethau a stondinâu a gyflwynir gan grwpiau a sefydliadau lleol a gwladol (megis Casgliad y Werin Cymru; Eisteddfod Genedlaethol Cymru; Cymdeithas Treftadaeth Ystradgynlais, i enwi ond ychydig). Bydd yr hyn oll yn rhoi cyfle i rannu storïau, syniadau, delweddau ac atgofion am waith Josef Herman; ei fywyd a'r cyfnod y bu yn byw ynddo; effaith ei athrylith ar Ystradgynlais a sut y gall yr hyn oll fod o les i'r dref a'r ardaloedd cyfagos.
